Results

Delete – Complete final results will be available to download from www.epyntmc.co.uk as soon as possible after the event.

Add – Complete final results will be available to download from www.rallyroots.com as soon as possible after the event.

Route

Delete – Competitors should ensure that they carry enough fuel to travel approximately 55 miles. Add – Competitors should ensure that they carry enough fuel to travel approximately 65 miles. The first half will consist of approximately 45 miles and the second half approximately 65 miles.

Start Venue - Llandovery

The Trailer Park, Noise Testing and Scrutineering will be held at Llandovery Market, Llandovery Car Park, Llandovery SA20 OAW. Please see the Start venue map on page 8.

Signing-on will be held at the Castle Hotel, Llandovery, SA20 0AP.

Trailer Park

Llandovery Market is accessed through Llandovery car park (turn into the car park by the Castle Hotel). The what3words location is ///ranch.screaming.games.

Please unload your car at the trailer park, then leave the Market to get fuel if needed, before returning to the Noise Test.

The gate to the Market will be locked after MC1 has closed until the end of the event. If you need access to your trailer during this time, please contact Rally Office. A phone number to do so will be given in the Emergency Contact List in your Competitor Pack.

Fuel

Fuel is available until 18:00hrs at Morris Isaacs, Queensway, Llandovery SA20 0EG. Super unleaded petrol is not available.

Fuel is also available until 22.00hrs at Manordeilo Service Station, which is located 7 miles from Llandovery on the A40 towards Llandeilo. Super unleaded petrol is not available.

Super unleaded petrol is available in Sennybridge, at Glanusk Service Station until 21:00hrs and Sennybridge Service Station until 20:00hrs. Both are 12 miles from Llandovery on the A40 towards Brecon.

Super unleaded petrol will not be available at the fuel halt.

Noise Test

Noise testing will commence at 17.00hrs and close at 20.30hrs. After completing the Noise Test, please proceed to Scrutineering which will be inside the Market building.

Scrutineering

Scrutineering will commence at 17.00hrs and close at 20.45hrs. Remember to bring all documents, as per the Scrutineering section of the Supplementary Regulations, as these will be checked.

Competitors are reminded that vehicles must have a valid MOT and be taxed. Any vehicles without a valid MOT and tax will not be permitted to start the event and the crew will not be refunded their entry fee.

Start Car Park

After scrutineering, please park as directed in your allocated bay and ensure any details missing from your process card are completed before you proceed on foot to Signing On.

Signing On

Signing On will be inside The Castle Hotel and will commence at 17.00hrs and finish at 21.00hrs. Please access Signing On through the rear Hotel car park.

You are not required to have your process card signed by marshals Signing on. Once your marshal has signed on, your competition number will be crossed off on a screen which will be visible to all. Please do not join the Marshals Signing On queue.

Any outstanding payment must be settled in cash.

The Basic Roamer Company will have their stall set up in the Signing On venue.

Competition licences

Licence applications will not be dealt with at Signing On. Please ensure that you have applied for an MSUK RS Interclub licence as a minimum before the event.

Competitors are reminded that if they are unable to produce a correct licence for inspection at Signingon they will have to pay a non-refundable fine to Motorsport UK of £37 for Non-production of Licence as per H21.1.2.

If you have any issues or questions about your licence, please contact the Event Secretary before 9pm on Thursday 9th November should MSUK need to be contacted.

Membership

Epynt Motor Club membership is being offered at £10 for membership up until 31st December 2024.

Any competitors wishing to apply for Epynt Motor Club membership must submit an <u>online Membership</u> form before Thursday 9th November or bring a <u>printed Membership</u> form to Signing On.

Insurance

Competitors are reminded that their vehicle must hold current road insurance. Standard road insurance will include the limitation that it cannot be used for competition or rally. Therefore, all competitors must have their own additional insurance cover by extending an existing motor policy to cover the event, or purchase the additional cover provided by the organisers as an adjunct to an existing motor policy.

If a competitor wishes to purchase additional Road Section cover via the organisers, then they can do so prior to the event providing they comply with the following:

- is aged 19 years or over
- has held a full driving licence for a minimum of 6 months
- has no more than 6 points on their licence
- has had no more than 1 fault claim in the last 3 years is named on a valid motor insurance policy for the vehicle they are driving
- do not have the Third-Party Extension cover on their existing motor policy
- the vehicle has a valid MOT and taxed for the road, unless exempt from doing so

Anyone aged less than 19 years old will also be accepted at the same price should their co-driver be a more senior member of their family or over 25.

Any competitor who falls outside these parameters may be offered cover at equivalent terms or an agreed price, if approval from the Appointed Insurance Broker has been obtained by the event organisers, prior to the event. Approval can be sought by sending an email to contact@reis.co.uk (copied to the Entries Secretary powyslanesrally@gmail.com) and provide the Drivers' name and date of birth, the date they passed their driving test and details of any motoring claims and/or convictions.

The basic rate per driver for the Insured event before any loadings will be £29.00 including insurance premium tax at 12% and £1.50 Broker fee. Insurance and any loadings must be paid for at Signing-on with cash only.

Competitors using their own insurance cover i.e., those using an extension to an existing policy and not running under the Reis scheme, must provide the name and address of their insurance provider on their Entry Form and will be required to sign a declaration that the cover complies with the requirements of the Road Traffic Act. Any responsibility for a fraudulent or misleading declaration about existing cover lies with the competitor.

If you have any queries regarding insurance, please contact the Event Secretary before 9pm on Thursday 9th November should Reis Motorsport Insurance need to be contacted.

Marshals

Marshals Signing On will be held at the Signing On venue and will commence at 16.30hrs and finish at 20.30hrs. Controls will be allocated on a first come first served basis.

Marshals who wish to man two controls must sign on by 18:00hrs.

Please ensure that your marshal brings Ordnance Survey Maps 146, 147 and 160, a torch, hammer, hivis tabard, pen and clipboard.

All controls will be given a what3words location, so please ensure your marshal has downloaded the what3words app.

Competitor's Meeting

A competitors meeting will be held at the Signing On venue at approximately 21:45hrs. All competitors must attend.

Schedule for the Event

Car '0' will have its route information at 22:21hrs at MC0, which will be at the Signing On venue.

Competitors in the Novice Class will also start to get their route at this time, e.g., the first novice crew will get their route at 22:22hrs at the same time as Car 1.

Your individual due time for MC0 will be displayed on the Official Notice Board at Signing On and via the Sportity app (see below for details).

Retirements

If you retire during the event, please inform the organisers as soon as possible. A contact number to do so will be given in your Competitor Pack. This is for your own safety so that we can account for all competitors.

Should you be involved in an accident, you must act as noted in the Road Traffic Act 1988 Section 170 and the Highway Code Rule 286, as included on page 7.

Finish

MC4 will be back at the Castle Hotel where breakfast will be available. Please produce your breakfast tickets, which will be in your Competitor Pack. Additional breakfasts can also be purchased.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1988 - Section 170

Duty of driver to stop, report accident and give information or documents

- (1) This section applies in a case where, owing to the presence of a motor vehicle on a road, an accident occurs by which -
- (a) personal injury is caused to a person other than the driver of that motor vehicle, or
- (b) damage is caused -
- (i) to a vehicle other than that motor vehicle or a trailer drawn by that motor vehicle, or
- (ii to an animal other than an animal in or on that motor vehicle or a trailer drawn by that motor vehicle, or
- (iii) to any other property constructed on, fixed to, growing in or otherwise forming part of the land on which the road in question is situated or land adjacent to such land.
- (2) The driver of the motor vehicle must stop and, if required to do so by any person having reasonable grounds for so requiring, give his name and address and also the name and address of the owner and the identification marks of the vehicle.
- (3) If for any reason the driver of the motor vehicle does not give his name and address under subsection (2) above, he must report the accident.
- (4) A person who fails to comply with subsection (2) or (3) above is guilty of an offence.
- (5) If, in a case where this section applies by virtue of subsection (1)(a) above, the driver of the vehicle does not at the time of the accident produce such a certificate of insurance or security, or other evidence, as is mentioned in section 165(2)(a) of this Act -
- (a) to a constable, or
- (b) to some person who, having reasonable grounds for so doing, has required him to produce it, the driver must report the accident and produce such a certificate or other evidence. This subsection does not apply to the driver of an invalid carriage.
- (6) To comply with a duty under this section to report an accident or to produce such a certificate of insurance or security, or other evidence, as is mentioned in section 165(2)(a) of this Act, the driver (a) must do so at a police station or to a constable, and
- (b) must do so as soon as is reasonably practicable and, in any case, within twenty-four hours of the occurrence of the accident.
- (7) A person who fails to comply with a duty under subsection (5) above is guilty of an offence, but he shall not be convicted by reason only of a failure to produce a certificate or other evidence if, within five days after the occurrence of the accident, the certificate or other evidence is produced at a police station that was specified by him at the time when the accident was reported.
- (8) In this section "animal" means horse, cattle, ass, mule, sheep, pig, goat or dog.



THE HIGHWAY CODE - Rule 286

If you are involved in a collision which causes damage or injury to any other person, vehicle, animal or property, you MUST:

- stop
- give your own and the vehicle owner's name and address, and the registration number of the vehicle, to anyone having reasonable grounds for requiring them.
- If you do not give your name and address at the time of the collision, report it to the police as soon as reasonably practicable, and in any case within 24 hours.




